Why the Call to Worship is so important. A couple of thoughts: first, we live in a society that teaches us to think highly of our own ability. Americans are a fiercely independent, selfmotivated people. The Call to Worship re-orients us to our dependence of God. We come to worship because God has a summons on our lives. We come to worship because God initiates with us (not the other way around). So the Call to Worship reminds us of God's sovereign reign over us. Second, in the Bible the earliest word used to describe the Church was ekklesia. (It's where we get our words "ecclesiastical" and "ecclesiology.") Its root is the Greek word kaleo, which means, "to call." The people of God, as the ekklesia, are "the called-out ones." When we hear the Call to Worship, we are being reminded of our identity as those called out and set apart by God for His holy purposes. We are reminded that we are not our own. We are reminded that we are "resident aliens" in this world. We are reminded that we are treasured and loved by God!

Eyes: Closed or Open? Those who visit us, who may not have been to many Christian worship services, might think it's a bit odd to look around and see eyes closed during the singing or eyes open during the praying. We close our eves in worship because it's a way of acknowledging that we worship a God who is unseen (Romans 1:20; 1 Timothy 1:17). In addition, because we are such a visual people, worshiping God may be more focused and easy with closed eyes because we are less distracted by the things and people around us. At the same time, there is great warrant for keeping our eyes open. Worship is not something we do in a vacuum. It's corporate (Ephesians 5:19-20). When we open our eyes and look around, it's a chance to affirm that we are called into a community of believers, not simply a private life with God. Open eyes may invite us to a more communal worship experience. So, because there are both vertical and horizontal dimensions to worship, the answer to "Eyes: Closed or Open?" is, "Yes!"
